AGENDA ITEM III

SENIOR STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS FOR FUNDING OF PROPOSALS SUBMITTED UNDER THE BOARD OF REGENTS SUPPORT FUND COMPETITIVE AND MATCHING GRANTS PROGRAMS, FY 2014-15

Agenda Item III comprises eight (8) Staff Recommendations for FY 2014-15 funding across thirteen (13) subprograms in the Board of Regents Support Fund. By these recommendations, the Board is asked to authorize 258 awards to 39 campuses. To expedite the meeting, the staff recommends that the Committee and Board consider these eight (8) Staff Recommendations in globo as a single motion.

SECTION A: INTRODUCTION

A.1 Constitutionally Prescribed Program Components

The Constitution specifies that the Board of Regents Support Fund may be used to support any or all of the following programs:

- a. The carefully defined research efforts at public and private universities in Louisiana;
- b. The endowment of chairs for eminent scholars;
- c. The enhancement of the quality of academic, research or agricultural departments or units within a university; and
- d. The recruitment of superior graduate students.

A.2 FY 2014-15 Board of Regents Support Fund Plan and Budget

a. Projected Budget and Funds Available

On December 4, 2013, the Board of Regents adopted the FY 2014-15 Plan and Budget for the Board of Regents Support Fund, which was later approved by the Governor and the Legislature. Based on Revenue Estimating Conference (REC) projections, the Plan and Budget allocated \$23,500,000 across Support Fund components as follows:

b. Actual Funds Available

Since approval of the FY 2014-15 BoRSF Plan and Budget in December 2013, the REC has issued several opinions relative to the amount of money projected to be available for higher education's portion of the Support Fund. The most recent estimate, released in January 2015, was \$24,850,000. This projection is higher than the previous guidance from REC and the Treasury, as well as projections used to derive the approved Plan and Budget; it is uncertain at this point, however, whether this higher level can be attained. Therefore, total BoRSF funds available for expenditure in FY 2014-15 anticipated to remain at \$23,500,000. The recommendations below reflect the programmatic distribution of available funds across BoRSF components. Note that recommendations encompass only first-year award amounts; additional monies from FY 2014-15 were committed for multi-year projects approved by the Board in previous fiscal years, as well as federal matching obligations, professional services for proposal review, and administrative costs for the Support Fund.

SECTION B: ENDOWED CHAIRS FOR EMINENT SCHOLARS COMPONENT

B.1 Competitive Endowed Chairs Subprogram

Nine (9) proposals were submitted and deemed eligible for funding consideration this year under the Competitive Subprogram. Six (6) proposals requested \$400,000 each from the Support Fund to endow \$1 million chairs; three (3) proposals requested \$800,000 from the Support Fund to endow \$2 million chairs. Three (3) of the \$400,000 matches were requested to raise the corpus levels of existing \$1 million chairs to \$2 million.

B.2 Restricted Bequest Endowed Chairs Subprogram

No requests for matching of restricted bequests were submitted in FY 2014-15.

B.3 Summary of the Endowed Chairs for Eminent Scholars Subprogram

The nine (9) Endowed Chairs proposals requested a total of \$4,800,000 in matching funds from the Support Fund. All disciplines were eligible to apply. A team of out-of-state consultants visited Louisiana in March 2015 to interview campus representatives, evaluate the proposals, and rank them using the guidelines provided in the Board's RFP and subprogram policy. (See **Appendix A** for the rank-order list of FY 2014-15 Endowed Chairs proposals.)

It should be noted that the following stipulation in the Board's Endowed Chairs policy is relevant to proposals submitted in the Competitive Subprogram: "...When requests exceed funds available, the following limitations apply relative to the amount of money that will be awarded per campus under the competitive program: (a) each public campus will be limited to \$1.2 million per fiscal year; and (b) all LAICU campuses combined will be limited to a total of \$1.2 million per fiscal year."

The \$2,020,000 projected in the FY 2014-15 Plan and Budget to be available in the Endowed Chairs for Eminent Scholars Subprogram includes \$20,000 for consultants. The remaining amount of \$2,000,000 will enable funding for proposals ranked 1, 2, 3, and 5 in the Competitive Subprogram. The proposal ranked fourth, from LSU and A&M College, must be deferred because insufficient monies remained after funding higher ranked applications to match it as proposed.

Senior Staff Recommendation

The Senior Staff recommends provision of Support Fund money at levels requested to complete the endowments for proposals ranked 1, 2, 3, and 5 in the Consultants' Report (i.e., proposals 008EC, 002EC, 001EC, and 007EC). (See Appendix A.)

SECTION C: ENHANCEMENT OF THE QUALITY OF DEPARTMENTS OR UNITS COMPONENT

C.1 Recommended New Traditional, Undergraduate and Two-Year Institutions Enhancement Projects

The \$12,403,706 figure cited in the FY 2014-15 Plan and Budget for Enhancement includes the following distributions:

The five eligible disciplines in the Traditional Enhancement and Undergraduate Enhancement subprogram components in FY 2014-15 are biological sciences, computer and information sciences, engineering B (industrial, materials, mechanical, etc.), humanities, and social sciences. The Enhancement Subprogram for Two-Year Institutions identifies guiding principles for proposal development rather than limiting submissions by academic discipline.

In the winter of 2014 and spring of 2015, eight teams of out-of-state consultants reviewed, evaluated and ranked the various types of competitive Enhancement proposals. Using the Board’s evaluation criteria, five teams evaluated, rated and ranked Traditional Enhancement proposals in the five eligible disciplines; the sixth, seventh and eighth teams, respectively, evaluated, rated and ranked Multidisciplinary Enhancement, Undergraduate Enhancement, and Enhancement for Two-Year Institutions subprograms. Each team had appropriate expertise and experience relative to the specific requirements of the discipline and/or component being reviewed.

With the exception of the Multidisciplinary component, the allocation level for each of the eligible disciplines in the Traditional Enhancement Subprogram was determined by calculating proposal pressure and the amount of Support Fund money requested per discipline as a percentage of the total proposal pressure and amount of Support Fund money requested across these five disciplines in the Traditional Enhancement component. As stipulated in the FY 2014-15 Plan and Budget, Multidisciplinary Enhancement was calculated as 20% of the total available. The total maximum funding anticipated to be available for meritorious proposals in each of the root disciplines in Traditional Enhancement as well as Multidisciplinary Enhancement, based on allocations in the FY 2014-15 Plan and Budget, was calculated as follows:

These amounts helped to guide consultants in the development of funding recommendations. Senior Staff Recommendations

- 1. Traditional Enhancement:** The \$3,938,598 available and recommended for expenditure shall be awarded in the rank order, at the funding levels, and with the funding stipulations recommended by consultants, and shall be divided among the five eligible disciplines and multidisciplinary projects as follows (see Appendix B):

- 2. Undergraduate Enhancement Subprogram:** A total of \$1,584,000 is recommended for expenditure for the top twenty-four (24) Undergraduate Enhancement proposals submitted in FY 2014-15. Proposals shall be awarded in the rank order, at the funding levels, and with the funding stipulations recommended by consultants. (See Appendix C.)
- 3. Enhancement Subprogram for Two-Year Institutions:** A total of \$1,094,000 is recommended for expenditure for the top sixteen (16) Enhancement Subprogram for Two-Year Institutions proposals submitted in FY 2014-15. Proposals shall be awarded in the rank order, at the funding levels, and with funding stipulations recommended by consultants. (See Appendix D.)
- 4. Should the amount of money ultimately available to fund first-year activities in Traditional, Undergraduate, and Enhancement Subprogram for Two-Year Institutions projects be less than the \$6,616,598 disbursed herein, the following principles shall apply:** (1) All Support Fund money shall be awarded in rank order, at funding levels and with stipulations recommended by consultants; (2) if the remaining money in the budget for a particular component or discipline is insufficient to fully fund the next recommended proposal for that component or discipline, the remaining funds shall constitute the total award for that proposal; and (3) should an institution refuse or be denied an award, that money shall be awarded to the next highest ranked proposal within that component or discipline. (See Appendices B, C, D and E.)

Appendix E summarizes – by campus and Enhancement component – the recommendations for new projects under the competitive Enhancement subprograms.

C.2 Endowed Professorships Subprogram

The Board of Regents Support Fund Endowed Professorships Subprogram requires the submitting college or university to raise at least \$60,000 from external sources, which is matched by \$40,000 from the Support Fund, thus establishing an endowed professorship valued at a minimum of \$100,000. The subprogram policy guarantees two \$40,000 matching slots to each four-year and special purpose campus, and one \$40,000 matching slot to each two-year campus.

The FY 2014-15 Support Fund Plan and Budget allocates a total of \$2,800,000 to the Endowed Professorships Subprogram, including \$1,600,000 for new and prior-year (resubmitted) requests and \$1,200,000 for requests in the backlog. With all requests validated, the Board received by the March 31, 2015 deadline applications for 168 Endowed Professorship \$40,000 slots (73 new requests; 17 prior-year requests; 78 backlogged) from 20 campuses, requiring \$6,720,000 in BoRSF matching funds. New/prior-year and backlogged requests are considered separately. Each submitting campus will receive a maximum of two matches (\$80,000) for new submissions and two matches (\$80,000) for prior-year submissions, totaling the full \$1,600,000 budgeted for regular submissions. The \$1,200,000 budgeted for backlogs will be allocated to match 30 backlogged slots, all at LSU and A&M College; \$120,000 will be transferred from the Endowed First-Generation Scholarships subprogram to match three additional backlogged slots (See **Appendix F.**) A complete list of Endowed Professorships applications submitted for funding consideration in FY 2014-15 appears in **Appendix G.**

Senior Staff Recommendation

The Senior Staff recommends approval of \$1,600,000 from the Support Fund to match forty (40) new and prior-year submissions to the Endowed Professorships Subprogram. A total of \$1,320,000 is recommended for thirty-three (33) backlogged submissions. (See Appendix F.)

C.3 First-Generation Endowed Undergraduate Scholarships

The Board of Regents Support Fund Endowed Undergraduate Scholarships Subprogram requires a submitting four-year college or university to raise at least \$60,000 from external or institutional sources, which is matched by \$40,000 from the Support Fund, thus establishing an endowed scholarship valued at a minimum of \$100,000; two-year campuses must provide \$30,000, to be matched with \$20,000 from the Support Fund to establish an endowed scholarship valued at a minimum of \$50,000.

The FY 2014-15 Support Fund Plan and Budget allocates a total of \$1,000,000 to the Endowed Undergraduate Scholarships Subprogram for the establishment of at least 25 endowed scholarships for first-generation undergraduate students. With all disciplines eligible and all requests validated, the Board has received applications for the matching of three (3) \$20,000 and thirty (30) \$40,000 scholarship matches. It would require \$1,260,000 to fund all submissions. A list of applications appears in **Appendix H.**

Each submitting campus will receive a maximum of two matches for scholarship submissions, totaling \$860,000. After funding two submissions per eligible campus, remaining funds of \$140,000 are insufficient to provide a third match to all campuses with more than two requests; of this remainder, \$120,000 shall be transferred to the Endowed Professorships program to match backlogged requests. (See Section C.2, above.)

Senior Staff Recommendation

The Senior Staff recommends approval of \$860,000 from the Support Fund to match twenty-three (23) applications submitted in FY 2014-15 under the First-Generation Endowed Undergraduate Scholarships Subprogram. (See Appendix H.)

SECTION D: RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT COMPONENT

D.1 Continuation of Previously Funded Research and Development (R&D) Projects and Other Prior Commitments

The \$4,620,000 cited in the FY 2014-15 Plan and Budget as being available for Research and Development (R&D) includes amounts for prior commitments to Support Fund R&D awards approved in previous years as well as approximately \$135,000 in consultants' costs for the FY 2014-15 R&D review process.

D.2 Recommended New Research and Development Projects

The R&D component of the BoRSF includes the Research Competitiveness Subprogram (RCS), the Industrial Ties Research Subprogram (ITRS), and the Awards to Louisiana Artists and Scholars (ATLAS) Subprogram. RCS solicits proposals that strengthen the research foundations and competitiveness of Louisiana colleges and universities and help to promote long-term economic development. ITRS targets proposals that support research with significant near-term potential for development and diversification of Louisiana's economic base. ATLAS supports completion of major scholarly and artistic endeavors from the arts, humanities, and social sciences with potential for broad impact on State, regional, national and/or international levels.

Eligible disciplines in RCS for FY 2014-15 were agriculture, biological sciences, computer/information sciences, earth and environmental sciences, engineering A (chemical, civil, and electrical and electronics), mathematics, physics and astronomy, and social sciences. Since 1993 ITRS has invited ideas across all disciplines for applied research projects that promoted near-term economic development in the State; therefore, no specific target areas or disciplines are defined. ATLAS accepts proposals in all arts, humanities and social sciences areas.

From November 2014 through March 2015, approximately 280 mail and subject-area reviewers and three final panels reviewed, evaluated, and ranked research proposals according to the Board's RFP guidelines and evaluation criteria. The final panels highly recommended for funding the top-ranked thirty-six (36) proposals in RCS (\$1,569,594 in first-year funds), nine (9) proposals in ITRS (\$559,030 in first-year funds), and twenty (20) proposals in ATLAS (\$729,682 in first-year funds). (See **Appendix I.**) It would require a total of \$2,858,306 to fund the first year of all new R&D awards rated Priority I by consultants.

Senior Staff Recommendations

The Senior Staff recommends approval of disbursement of \$2,489,500 estimated to be available in FY 2014-15 to fund the first year of new RCS, ITRS, and ATLAS projects as follows:

1. **Research Competitiveness Subprogram: \$1,375,970**
2. **Industrial Ties Research Subprogram: \$559,030**
3. **Awards to Louisiana Artists and Scholars Subprogram: \$554,500**

Approved R&D proposals shall be funded at the levels and with the stipulations recommended by consultants. Support Fund money shall be awarded to fund at recommended levels the top thirty-one (31) RCS proposals, nine (9) ITRS proposals, and sixteen (16) ATLAS proposals; the thirty-second ranked RCS proposal and seventeenth-ranked ATLAS proposal shall be funded partially with remaining funds available for expenditure. In addition, the following principles shall apply: (1) should an institution refuse or be denied an award, or should FY 2014-15 money be returned from previously funded R&D contracts, that money shall first be used to provide full funding to rank orders partially supported with remaining funds, then offered to the next-ranked proposal which the consultants recommended for Priority I funding within the respective subprogram (ranks 18-20 in ATLAS and ranks 33-36 in RCS), subject to availability of funds; (2) if the remaining money in the budget for a particular component is insufficient to fully fund the next-ranked recommended proposal for that component, the remaining funds shall constitute the total award for that proposal; and (3) if there are no remaining Priority I proposals in a particular subprogram the money shall be awarded in descending rank order to Priority I proposal(s) in another R&D subprogram in accordance with restrictions applicable to allocation of funds for multi-year projects. Should the amount of money ultimately available to fund first-year activities in all R&D projects be less than the \$2,489,500 disbursed herein, adherence to the following principles shall be uniformly enforced: R&D Priority I proposals shall be funded in rank order at the levels and the durations and with the stipulations recommended by consultants until the funds designated for each component have been exhausted. (See Appendix I.)

Appendix I also includes a summary, by campus and R&D subprogram, of new projects recommended for funding.

SECTION E: RECRUITMENT OF SUPERIOR GRADUATE STUDENTS COMPONENT

E.1 Traditional Graduate Fellowships and Graduate Fellowships for Teachers

Awards must be made under the Recruitment of Superior Graduate Students Program component more than one year prior to the time that funds are provided for the first year of the fellowship, since at least one year is required

to conduct student recruitment activities, and committed for all remaining years to ensure ongoing student support.

The ten eligible disciplines in the Traditional Graduate Fellows component in FY 2014-15 are agricultural sciences, biological sciences, business, chemistry, computer and information sciences, earth and environmental sciences, education, engineering A and B, health and medical sciences, mathematics, and physics and astronomy.

In February 2015, a team of out-of-state consultants, with expertise in both doctoral and master’s-level programs, reviewed, rated and ranked twenty-nine (29) Traditional Graduate Fellowships proposals and one (1) Graduate Fellowships for Teachers proposal in accordance with the Board’s evaluation criteria. A total of \$2,578,500 in first-year funds was requested in Traditional Graduate Fellowships and \$120,000 in Graduate Fellowships for Teachers. Consultants were informed that \$900,000 in first-year funds were allocated in the Plan and Budget for new Graduate Fellowships projects, up to 20% of which could be set aside for meritorious Graduate Fellowships for Teachers applications. All funded projects will begin in FY 2016-17.

Of the proposals submitted, the consultants recommended the top-rated eighteen (18) Traditional Graduate Fellowships applications, for a total first-year expenditure of \$819,500, and the single GFT application, for a total first-year expenditure of \$80,000. (See **Appendix J.**) Yearly funding totals for all recommended proposals are:

Senior Staff Recommendation

The Senior Staff recommends approval of funding for the eighteen (18) top-ranked Traditional Graduate Fellows proposals and one (1) Graduate Fellowships for Teachers proposal submitted in the FY 2014-15 cycle for the durations and at the levels recommended by consultants. (See Appendix J.)

E.2 BoRSF/Southern Regional Education Board Graduate Fellowships to Promote Diversity Subprogram

Four (4) institutions submitted a total of four (4) proposals requesting funds for the support of 16 doctoral fellows in the FY 2014-15 competitive cycle for this subprogram. (See **Appendix J.**) A total of \$400,000 in first-year funds was requested. Consultants recommended support for three (3) applications, for which funding will begin in FY 2015-16.

Available monies will allow funding for the three (3) top-ranked proposals, for a total first-year allocation of \$200,000. For the recommended proposals, the yearly funding totals are:

Senior Staff Recommendation

The Senior Staff recommends approval of funding for the three (3) top-ranked proposals submitted in the FY 2014-15 cycle to the BoR/SREB Graduate Fellowships to Promote Diversity Subprogram for the durations and at the levels recommended by consultants. (See Appendix J.)

Appendix J also contains a summary of the recommendations of new Traditional Graduate Fellowships, Graduate Fellowships for Teachers, and BoR/SREB Graduate Fellowships proposals solicited in FY 2014-15, for which funding will begin in FY 2016-17 and FY 2015-16 respectively.

SECTION F: CONTINGENCY PLAN FOR BUDGETARY SHORTFALL

Senior Staff Recommendation

The Senior Staff recommends approval of the following contingency plan for a budgetary shortfall: should the final FY 2014-15 Support Fund budget not achieve the amount cited herein, any shortfall shall be accommodated through a proportionate reduction in the amounts allocated for proposals in the competitive Enhancement and Research and Development program components.

SECTION G: CAMPUS SUCCESS RATES

Appendix K contains a chart that summarizes – by campus and program – the number of proposals submitted to Support Fund components, proposals recommended for funding, and first-year and total funding recommended for all Priority I proposals during the FY 2014-15 BoRSF competitive cycle.

Request from Southeastern Louisiana University to Divide the Edward G. Schlieder Foundation Endowed Chair

Background Information

The Edward G. Schlieder Foundation Endowed Chair is a \$1 million Endowed Chair established with BoRSF match in FY 1996-97 at Southeastern Louisiana University. The Chair is currently vacant.

Staff Summary

In August 2011, the Board of Regents approved a policy to permit the division of Endowed Chairs funds to establish Endowed Professorships at a minimum level of \$250,000. Pursuant to this policy, two institutions (Nicholls State University and McNeese State University) have previously divided chairs into professorships.

Under this policy and with approval of the donor, Southeastern Louisiana University requests authorization to divide the Edward G. Schlieder Foundation Endowed Chair into four Super Professorships, each with a corpus value of \$250,000, as follows:

- Edward G. Schlieder Foundation Professorship of Environmental Studies and Sustainability #1
- Edward G. Schlieder Foundation Professorship of Environmental Studies and Sustainability #2
- Edward G. Schlieder Foundation Professorship of Environmental Studies and Sustainability #3
- Edward G. Schlieder Foundation Professorship of Environmental Studies and Sustainability #4

The staff notes that current Board policy supports and encourages the establishment of professorships at levels above \$100,000.

Senior Staff Recommendation

Consistent with the August 2011 policy, the Senior Staff recommends that the Sponsored Programs Committee approve division of the Edward G. Schlieder Foundation Endowed Chair into four (4) endowed professorships, named the Edward G. Schlieder Foundation Professorship of Environmental Studies and Sustainability #1-4, each with a corpus value of \$250,000.

AGENDA ITEM V

Southern University System Nomination to the Master Plan Research Advisory Committee (MPRAC)

Background Information

The Board of Regents Master Plan Research Advisory Committee (MPRAC) provides guidance to the Board of Regents relative to fulfillment of the goal of the 2011 Master Plan related to research and technology transfer. Membership of MPRAC consists of one representative from each four-year system and each campus with a significant research program.

Staff Summary

Dr. Ronald Mason, President of the Southern University System, has nominated Dr. Patrick Mensah, Professor in the Department of Mechanical Engineering, Southern University and A&M College, to serve as SUS's representative on MPRAC.

Senior Staff Recommendation

Senior Staff recommends that the Board of Regents approve the nomination of Dr. Mensah to the Master Plan Research Advisory Committee.
