The university is accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC) and the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE).

ACADEMIC PROGRAM

UMASS Global offers 27 programs that lead to doctorate, master's, bachelor's, and associate degrees as well as certificate programs. UMASS Global offers programs in Business, Education, Nursing & Health Sciences, Social Sciences, Communications, and Criminal Justice. The university currently has 24 students in its Louisiana Unduplicated Headcount Enrollment.

Agenda Item III.A.3.a John Melvin University Crowley, LA

Background

Revised Statue 17:1808 requires the Board of Regents (BoR) to register and license academic degree-granting, post-secondary institutions in Louisiana. Regents' rules and regulations overseeing the review process echo the revised statutes, emphasizing the attainment of appropriate accreditation.

John Melvin University (JMU) has identified the Transnational Association of Christian Colleges and Schools (TRACS) as its desired accreditation agency. TRACS accreditation aims to instill quality postsecondary educational experience within the context of the spiritual development of the individual by monitoring curriculum, programs, faculty credentials, and measured student learning outcomes at the course, program and institutional levels.

Overview of John Melvin University

According to their proposal, the University strives to deliver high-quality non-denominational Christian education and to engage individuals in challenging academic opportunities that allow them to reach their highest potential.

JMU's initial offerings are four degree programs. Program courses will be offered in Online Learning (OL), Distance Learning (DL), and Hybrid Learning (HL) formats. The University will also offer several degrees that are religious in nature and exempt from licensure under RS 17:1808 J.2.

The College plans to offer the following programs:

• Bachelor of Science in Business Administration

 Program Objective: this program provides students with specialized concentrations available in Management, Hospitality Management, Marketing, Agribusiness Management, and Healthcare Administration.

• Master of Science in Business Administration

 Program Objective: this program provides students with skills needed within the demands of the global business environment and allows for a specialization in Healthcare Administration.

• Bachelor of Science in Kinesiology

o **Program Objective**: this program provides students with specialized concentrations in Sports Management, Pre-Athletic Training, Sports Psychology and Exercise Science and Fitness.

Master of Science in Kinesiology

o **Program Objective**: this program provides students with specialized concentrations in Sports Science, Sports Management, Health and Wellness, and Sports Psychology.

Academic Leadership and Faculty Qualifications

John Melvin University identified academic leadership and faculty to develop and deliver quality education programs.

David Angeron serves as the CEO. He has teaching certifications in both Louisiana and Florida and is a Certified Sport Psychology Coach. He earned a Bachelor of Science in Health and Physical Education from Nicholls State University and a Master of Science in Healthcare Administration from the University of New Orleans. Ms. Angela Houston serves as Vice President and Chief Academic Officer. She earned her Bachelor of Arts in Education from the University of Louisiana at Lafayette and a Master of Educational Leadership from Mississippi College. She is currently pursuing a Doctor of Education in Higher Education Administration with a projected graduation date of August 2024.

The University submitted resumes for twelve faculty who will provide instruction for the programs they plan to deliver.

<u>Chronology of Activities Related to Board of Regents' Consideration of the Application for Licensure</u> for John Melvin University

November 2021 – John Melvin University registered as a religious degree granting institution, exempt from licensure under RS 17:1808 J.2.

December 2021 – The Board of Regents received an application for licensure from John Melvin University for non-religious programs, with the Distance Education Accrediting Commission (DEAC) as their identified accrediting agency.

January 2022 – Regents' staff conducted an initial assessment of license application submitted by JMU and staff concluded that further internal assessment would benefit from an in-depth accreditation process.

February 2022 – Staff engaged the services of Ms. Susan Chiaramonte, President, EduCred Services, to assess JMU's application for licensure and associated materials considering the proposed institution's probability of successful accreditation.

April 2022 – JMU's formal assessment report was received, and the University was deemed *not reasonably prepared* to begin offering the proposed programs. This report was also emailed to the University's CEO.

May 2022 – After additional discussion with EduCred, Staff determined, that JMU would be allowed at minimum six months to make corrections noted in the report, but no more than twelve months. If the corrections submitted were again found to be not reasonably prepared, the application would be sent to the Board for a denial of licensure.

January 2023 – The Board of Regents received an updated application for licensure from John Melvin University with the Transnational Association of Christian Colleges and Schools (TRACS) as their identified accrediting agency.

February 2023 – Regents' staff conducted an initial assessment of the updated application as well as the newly chosen accrediting agency.

March 2023 – Staff concluded that further internal assessment would benefit from an in-depth accreditation process.

March 2023 – Staff engaged the services of Ms. Susan Chiaramonte, President, EduCred Services, to assess JMU's updated application for licensure and associated materials considering the proposed institution's probability of successful TRACS accreditation.

May 30, 2023 – Ms. Chiaramonte submitted to the Board of Regents' staff and the University CEO her formal evaluative assessment report relevant to the University's application for initial conditional licensure with the considered opinion that the University was *reasonably prepared* to meet TRACS accreditation requirements.

June 2022 – Staff determined, with addition of the assessment from EduCred, that John Melvin University should be considered for conditional licensure.

Staff Conclusion

Given the circumstances described in the assessment report, John Melvin University (JMU) merits a limited state licensure period to allow it enough time to seek TRACS candidacy and accreditation. This conditional licensure period should be subject to the fulfillment of several stipulations which require step-by-step continuous evidence of progress toward accreditation. To avoid any doubts regarding the seriousness of the Regents' intent in the matter, JMU should structure these stipulations in such a way that failure to complete fully may result in the immediate revocation of the conditional licensure. The motion and stipulations below are designed to ensure that JMU operates within Louisiana only if there is unquestioned evidence that reasonable accreditation progress is being made.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Senior Staff recommends conditional licensure for John Melvin University, for three years, provided:

- 1. By June 1, 2024, and on that date every year thereafter, during the term of conditional licensure, JMU shall report to Staff the status of its progress toward preparation for submittal of an application for accreditation candidacy through TRACS. This report shall, at a minimum, provide evidence of attendance and participation of appropriate JMU officials at periodic TRACS workshops for pre-applicant institutions and general membership meetings and work towards specific Accreditation Requirements as outlined in the EduCred Assessment Report.
- 2. At the end of this period of conditional licensure, JMU shall provide evidence of the submittal of an application for TRACS candidacy. If accomplished, the Regents will consider another eighteen months of licensure. If not achieved, the Regents will consider the denial of further licensure.
- 3. Within one year of applying for TRACS candidacy, JMU shall provide evidence of successful TRACS candidacy status. If granted, the Regents will consider extending licensure to allow for final accreditation review. If not accomplished, the Regents will consider the denial of further licensure.
- 4. Upon termination of the allotted time for final accreditation review, JMU shall report its TRACS membership status. If TRACS accreditation has been granted, the Regents shall consider issuing a regular 2-year operating license. If not granted, the Regents will consider the denial of further licensure.
- 5. At any point, if JMU does not progress toward accreditation, the Regents will consider the denial of further licensure.

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Minutes Board of Regents' Proprietary Schools Advisory Commission May 9, 2023

The Louisiana Board of Regents' Proprietary Schools Advisory Commission met Tuesday, May 9, 2023, in Room 153 in the Claiborne Building. Chair James Fontenot called the meeting to order at 10:05 a.m. The roll was then called by Ms. Courtney Britton and a quorum was established. There were no public comments to be read.

The first item of business was the approval of minutes from the Commission's meeting on March 14, 2023.

On motion of Chris Broadwater, seconded by Carmen Million, the Proprietary Schools Advisory Commission unanimously adopted the minutes of the March 14, 2023, Proprietary Schools Advisory Commission meeting.

The next item considered by the Commission was initial license applications. The only initial license application was from Cooper's Defensive Driving School, located in Violet, LA. The school was represented by owner, Ms. Sherleen Cooper. Mr. Antonio Williams reviewed the materials for the Commission members, informing them that the institution was proposing to offer one program: Class B CDL (80 clock hours).

Discussion included the owner's background and inspiration around school, the need for CDL drivers and the statewide shortage of bus drivers, the different types of CDLs and the potential occupations students could seek, the school's equipment, third party testing plans, financials and insurance, as well as the school's plans for class size, advertising, recruitment and enrollment, and background checks.

On motion of Chris Broadwater, seconded by Melanie Amrhein, the Proprietary Schools Advisory Commission unanimously voted that the Board of Regents approve the initial license application for Cooper's Defensive Driving, Violet, Louisiana.

The next agenda item considered by the Commission was operating license renewals. Over the previous two months, 20 schools submitted complete renewal applications.
