	In 2023, the Louisiana Board of Regents launched the inaugural <b>Untapped Talent Summit</b> to spotlight the experiences of formerly incarcerated individuals and elevate innovative programs improving outcomes for justice-impacted learners. Separately, the <b>Louisiana Education in Prison Task Force</b> released a 2024 report detailing the current landscape of postsecondary education in prison and outlining bold recommendations for systemic improvement.				
	In 2025, Louisiana was selected by the <b>State Higher Education Executive Officers (SHEEO) Association</b> to join a five-state learning community focused on deepening collaboration across higher education, corrections, and community partners.				
	With these efforts as a foundation, <b>Untapped Talent 2.0: Ready to Work!</b> aims to explore the Task Force recommendations and lay the groundwork for a coordinated, high-quality postsecondary education system within Louisiana's correctional facilities.

	Former Tennessee State Representative Michael G. Curcio and Jared Campbell will share insights on Tennessee's model approach to postsecondary education for incarcerated learners, including its commitment to offering education and mentoring access in every state prison. Their remarks will highlight cross-sector collaboration among legislators, corrections officials, business leaders, and nonprofit partners like the Tennessee Higher Education Initiative. But it's not all academics and data modeling. Curcio and Jared will tell how a combination of good public policy, hard work, and saying "yes" to a seemingly impossible project paved the way for an unlikely meeting in Tennessee's oldest prison on the farm in Hickman County. 	Room: Poydras	of higher education must ensure that they are properly collecting, identifying, and storing information about the students they enroll in correctional facilities. Ithaka S+R recently published a report on its multi-year research initiative exploring the current landscape of data use in the higher-education-in-prison field and identified barriers to building a more comprehensive and sustainable data infrastructure. At the same time, Loyola University New Orleans is developing a resource for higher-education-in-prison program leaders to ensure their institutions are correctly collecting incarcerated student data as part of the American Institutes for Research Higher Education in Prison Technical Assistance cohort. Louisiana colleges and universities are invited to learn more and develop practical solutions to data challenges.

	Room: Magazine	data infrastructure for robust data collection, analysis, and sharing," especially related to post-release education and employment outcomes. Reliable data in this area have historically been difficult to obtain.  In response to a 2023 legislative mandate, Louisiana established its first longitudinal data system, LA FIRST (Louisiana's Foundational Integrated Research System for Transformation), housed at the Kathleen Babineaux Blanco Public Policy Center. The Blanco Center published early findings in April 2025, including a report linking education, employment, adult corrections, and juvenile justice.  Strategic partnerships with the Blanco Center and LA FIRST offer Louisiana an unprecedented opportunity to track and improve outcomes for incarcerated learners, both pre- and post-release.

A recent Vera Institute report helps bridge the gap by identifying "good jobs" for people with records. These are jobs that pay well and avoid major legal/licensing roadblocks. Louisiana is now localizing these data by Regional Labor Market Area to ensure programs offered inside correctional facilities lead to real employment opportunities upon release.  The goal: Smarter program selection, stronger regional partnerships, and clear pathways to mobility that help Louisiana meet its attainment and workforce goals.

Through collaboration among state agencies, correctional educators, and workforce partners, the state is scaling models that safely equip justice-involved individuals with the tools and training needed for success.

This highlights the need for more tailored student support. What challenges do learners face inside, and how can institutions proactively address them through services and peer mentorship? Looking ahead, how might Louisiana adapt a "veteran-friendly-type" campus designation to support formerly incarcerated students and ensure they have a fair chance at success. Yet scalable, successful models exist, like Louisiana Delta Community College's (LDCC's) welding programs at Ouachita and Riverbend Correctional Centers. As the first Louisiana institution to receive Prison Education Program (PEP) status from the U.S. Department of Education, LDCC exemplifies the power of strategic collaboration among community colleges, local facilities, and employers to deliver career-aligned education to justice-impacted learners.
