Student Tuition Assistance & Revenue Trust (START) 529/529A Savings Accounts

- College – Account holders deposit funds to help pay for college
 - Created in 1995
- K-12 – Account holders maintain an investment account to pay for tuition at any state private school
 - Created in 2018
- ABLE (Achieving a Better Life Experience) – Account holders may provide for children and young adults with disabilities to support housing, education/training, health and wellness services
 - Created in 2017

Cyber Incident in late September 2025

- START accounts server was not impacted

Seeking a More Secure System

- HB749 (Carver) – Allows for the transfer of all operations related to the savings accounts to a third-party manager
 - Collaborative effort between the State Treasury, Office of Technology Services, Division of Administration, Governor's Office, and Legislative Leadership
 - Received \$4M in the Governor's Executive Budget and remained throughout the budget process

Student Tuition Assistance & Revenue Trust (START) 529/529A Savings Accounts

- Third-party Software Vendor
 - Account holders manage their funds on-line via a customized platform
 - 30+ years of experience, over 40 states managed
 - High level of state-specific customer service
 - Current regulatory management is maintained
 - ABLE account beneficiaries receive a debit card
 - Multiple layers of cybersecurity and fraud protections

- The Regular Legislative Session concluded on Monday, June 1
- \$123.3M State Funds increase for higher education:
 - \$5.8M increase for FY26 (one-time funds)
 - \$117.5M increase for FY 27
 - \$65.6M increase in State General Fund
 - Includes \$56M in Formula Funding
 - \$51.9M increase in Statutory Dedications

This budget includes full funding for TOPS (\$290.3M), increases funding for the M.J. Foster Scholars (\$25M) and maintains GO Grants (\$70.5M) and Patriot Scholars (\$6M) programs.

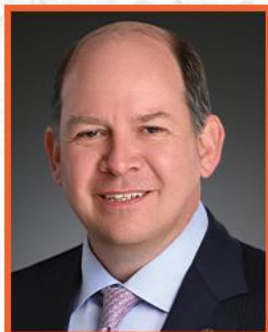
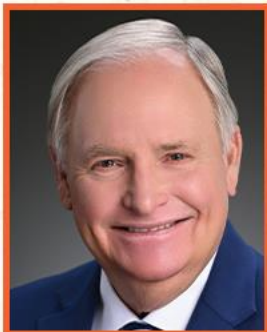
